



The Q-Link Phenomenon: Friendships and Relationships in Our Online Community

You probably became aware of the "phenomenon" shortly after you first signed on to Q-Link. You found yourself in a room in People Connection, and the conversation went something like this:

RJScott: Hey, everyone! There's a QWedding in Bonnie's Bar!

EileenC: ::heading to Bonnie's::

YOU: A QWedding?

RJScott: A couple gets married online...

YOU: You mean for real?

RJScott: For real...well....they think so!

YOU: How could you marry someone you met online?

RJScott: ;) (a wink)

Members meeting and falling in love. Members developing personal and

professional friendships that spill into their offline lives. It's the "Q-Link phenomenon" that we rarely discuss or define. But it's one of Q-Link's most alluring features.

When Quantum's staff first developed Q-Link's software, little did they know the impact of anonymous "screen names." Q-Link developers were concerned about protecting members' identities on what they hoped would be a large, national telecommunications network. Rather than institute the impersonal "account numbers" prevalent on other networks, Quantum's staff reasoned it would be much more personable, and entertaining, to allow members to create an online name.

"We imagined members creating online personas," says Cathleen Ander-

son, Quantum's vice president of Online Services. "We thought members could create likenesses of themselves, but also be 'TSelleck' or 'LindaEvans' if they wished."

No one could have imagined the impact of the decision.

"The anonymity afforded members on Q-Link is one of its most important features," says "Arrienne" (screen name), a mental health professional and counselor who monitors the Issues in Mental Health message boards in Just For Fun's Family Center.

Barriers to Friendships Fade

"It's very easy to hide behind your screen name, especially in the comfort of your own home. Anonymity strips away members' initial biases — discriminating factors that might make them choose one personal relationship over another," she says.

These factors include sex, race, creed, color, modes of expression, and dialect.

Arrienne adds: "This anonymity is a huge plus for Q-Link, leading members to forge relationships they might never have attempted before. It allows them to pursue friendships without caution.

Arrienne believes that the anonymous, online environment leads members to "get to the heart of the person first, and get to the person's external characteristics second."

Preconceptions and misconceptions are discarded as members initiate more personal conversations, debate politics and philosophies, and share memories of times online. Unlikely friendships develop over shared interests and experiences.


Arrienne thinks the Q-Link way of getting to know people has a very real and important impact on members' offline lives.

"Q-Link teaches you to be open to all types of people, rather than reinforcing

personal biases." This lesson is not forgotten when members turn off their computers."

Immediate Closeness

In her informal discussions with members about how their online relationships developed, Arrienne says that members express a feeling of almost immediate closeness with other members. Relationships online seem to progress faster than offline. And this progression seems to follow a predictable pattern.

First, two people meet online and share conversations about their families, jobs, personal problems, and past relationships. Then, they exchange phone numbers and wrestle with the thought of communicating by voice. After the voice connection has been made, they discuss the inevitable face-to-face meeting.

"After they meet in person," says Arrienne, "the relationship proceeds at light speed. It's 'Yes' or 'No.' 'All' or 'Nothing.' "

To a new member or someone who has never used an online service before, this progression might be troubling. A typical response might be: How can you be serious about someone you've never met? But to a member who knows the anonymity and intimacy of online communications, being swept off your feet at first meeting is not out of the question.

Neither is it odd to have a best friend you've never met face to face.

Abusing Confidences

There are negatives associated with anonymous screen names. Some members do portray themselves as people they are not. Members have been duped, dumped, and have ended up broken-hearted.

Arrienne sees the bright side: "A month or so ago, I held a conference on

relationships in the Family Center. A number of men at the conference didn't understand why women online found some men's persistence at sending suggestive online messages disruptive and insulting. They were just having fun, the men said."

"So, I suggested they create female screen names and cruise the lobbies in People Connection as available females. After receiving some rather brash online messages, their eyes were opened."

Who Are These People?


According to Jane Holtje, Quantum's Acquisitions Marketing manager, the people who choose to become online communicators and subscribe to Q-Link are a unique bunch, as if you didn't know.

Of all the heads of households who subscribe, Holtje says that 41.2% are in "professional/management" careers. More than 25% have "technical" careers; 15% are students; 15% hold other occupations. Sixty eight percent of Q-Link members are over age 30.

Here are even more impressive figures — nearly 82% of Q-Link's membership has attended college. About 78% make more than \$30,000 a year.

"Our impressions of Q-Linkers are confirmed through their participation in online Opinion Polls and Election Straw Polls," says Jane DeLorenzo, Quantum's producer of news and education services. "Gauging from their activity in our debate boards and polls, they are well-educated and have a very strong interest in politics. They appear to be up-to-date and aware of current events."

According to DeLorenzo, the party preferences of Q-Linkers hover around 42% Republican, 33% Democrat, 20% Independent, and 4% other. Q-Linkers'



interest in building upon their work skills and education is evidenced by their attendance in classes at Quantum Community College (QCC), located in the Learning Center.

"Last semester at QCC, we had the best registration ever. The most popular courses were accounting, BASIC programming, business survey, typing and word processing," says DeLorenzo. "But we also had a great interest in the Japanese language class!"

Eileen Clark, Quantum's assistant producer of communications, has some interesting data about Q-Linkers, compiled in the QMatch Show Survey. The survey is used to produce the QMatch Show every month in People Connection's Auditorium. During the show, contestants are asked to guess fellow Q-Linkers' most popular answer to each survey question.



General/Beginners Computing Support Group: For the New and Not-so-new to Computing

New and not-so-new members should look into what the Commodore Information Network's (CIN) General/Beginners Computing Support Group has to offer.

Along with a library full of helpful text and programs to download, message boards, and up-to-the-minute computing news, this group has something even more special to offer—the expertise of long-time Commodore enthusiast Jim Oldfield.

Jim has had years of experience in the world of Commodore computing. As both a hobby and a career, computing keeps Jim busy nearly 24-hours a day! In his day-time job, Jim is vice president of Micro-PACE Computers, a large computer distributor in Illinois.

Prior to joining Micro-PACE, Jim worked for many years in computer retail. "I literally had every type of machine imaginable." Working with all types of machines and all types of people with different computing needs, Jim developed a talent for matching a person's needs with the right equipment.

In the General/Beginners Support Group, Jim helps members evaluate

their needs and recommends both software and hardware. "If you can understand your machine better, you can make better decisions later. And your Commodore won't end up in the garage!"

Don't Be Shy, Ask!

Jim has been active in many user groups, but sees the Computing Support Group on Q-Link as offering a unique medium for beginners. "I talk to a lot of user groups where people feel shy about asking questions in front of everyone else." One of the best qualities of the online medium is that people can ask those questions and not feel awkward.

"Over the years, I have run into many of the same problems new users have encountered. I began learning the ins and outs of this machinery just as you will: by asking *lots* of questions."

Helpful Text and Info

The libraries in CIN's General/Beginners Support Group contain pertinent information for those new to computing, or new to Q-Link. Under "Helpful Text and Info" in the Support Group, you can download a map of Q-Link to show you what's where on the system. There's also an updated file containing the latest in "Q Shorthand"—you know, those funny symbols people write after a phrase to emphasize a feeling.

Monthly Forums

Another of Jim's laundry list of computing experiences is his affiliation with *The Midnite Software Gazette/The Paper*. The *Gazette*, co-founded by Jim, was one of the first national magazines for Commodore computer users. The *Gazette* is now part of *Info Magazine*.

Jim runs the *Midnite Software Ga-*

zette/Info Auditorium event held every third Friday of each month in People Connection's Auditorium. Bob Baker, who runs our new Product Information Area in the Commodore Software Showcase, and *Info Magazine* editor Bob Brown, join Jim in this event. allow all kinds of conditional assemblies. It has all the state-of-the-art features you'd expect, including some you probably never thought possible. For example, integrating graphics is as simple as cutting and pasting the image from geoPaint directly into your program.

geoLinker ties your program modules together, supporting GEOS SEQ and VLIR applications and desk accessories. You can even use geoAssembler and geoLinker to create non-GEOS applications.

geoDebugger allows your program to be tested in memory with full symbolic disassembly, along with line assembly for patching code in memory. It also allows your code to be single-stepped or top-stepped, with sub-routines fully executed. It can stop a running program with one key, or use up to eight conditional breakpoints. When your program hits the breakpoint, it prominently displays the error in an overlay window, leaving the applications screen intact.

Pro enough for you yet? Well, that's only a *partial* list of what you're in for.

If you understood all that, read on.


